Directions to Antioch:

From the south: Take I35 north to Antioch exit. Turn left, north, until 64th street. Turn left and the school will be on the right 2 blocks down.

From the north: Take I35 to hwy 152 west to MO 1 exit. Turn left, south, to 64th Street. Turn right and the school will be on the right 2 blocks down.

From the east: Take I70 to I35 north and follow directions from the south.

From the west: Take I70 to I35 north and follow directions from the south.

Full Day Camp 9:00 am—4:00 pm. Violinists, violists who play violin, cellists and bassists must be able to play comfortably in the keys of A, D, and G major (The violin equivalent of the piece "Hunters' Chorus" in Suzuki Volume 2).

A fiddling showcase concert concludes the camp at 3:30 on Friday in the auditorium. It's amazing what's learned in 5 days.
